Description About the Attendance of Birth

Attendance of birth, which was suspended due to the Corona virus (COVID-19) infections, will be resumed from deliveries taking place after 10:00 am, October 28, 2021.

For the time being, there will be the following restrictions and conditions. If the infection prevails in the city, this service will be suspended again, without prior notice. We appreciate your kind understanding in advance.

* Restrictions and Conditions for Attendance of Birth *

 \odot In principle, only one member of the family can be present: the spouse, or the mother of the mother-to-be, or the partner.

⊙ The family member can attend from just before delivery up to 20-30 minutes after delivery.
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 When the mother-to-be reaches 34 weeks into pregnancy, the attendant will also have to start observing his/her physical condition using the "Physical Condition Management Table.
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The attendant should not have any YES answers on the "Physical Condition Management Table." (If you have circled even one YES, then you will not be able to attend the birth.)
You will have to wear personal protective equipment to prevent infections.
You have to have completed the vaccination twice against COVID-19, and 2 weeks should have lapsed from the last vaccination. ※3

be able to attend the birth when the delivery progresses too rapidy. Approximately 20 to 30 minutes after delivery, the attendant will have to leave and return home. When the staff requests you to leave, you need to leave the room quickly. We appreciate your cooperation.

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Al ease download the "Physical Condition Management Table" from the hospital swebsite. If you forget to bring the "Physical Condition Management Table" on the day you wish to attend the birth, you will not be allowed to do so. If you also show any symptoms, etc. on the "Physical Condition Management Table," we need to ask you to leave, and you will not be able to attend the birth.

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Please bring the "Vaccination Certificate of COVI D 19." If we cannot confirm that you had completed COVI D 19 vaccination twice, you will not be able to attend the birth.

Other visits such as visiting the patients, excluding the time of birth, are still prohibited. Attending patients for outpatient visits is also not allowed currently. We appreciate your kind cooperation and understanding.
